While attending the University of New Mexico, she served as an intern through the Fred Harris Congressional Internship Program to Congressman Ben Ray Lujan (NM-03) in Washington, D.C. While in Congressman Lujan's office, Ms. Rivera assisted on Tribal issues and on constituent services. Ms. Rivera was also an intern in the Albuquerque, New Mexico office of a medical malpractice law firm and served as an intern to Congresswoman Michelle Lujan Grisham (NM-01) in both Albuquerque, New Mexico and Washington, D.C. While in Congresswoman Grisham's office, Ms. Rivera was tasked with outreach to the New Mexico's tribal nations on behalf of the office. In addition, she also planned constituent events and served as a casework liaison to Congresswoman Grisham's constituents.
